

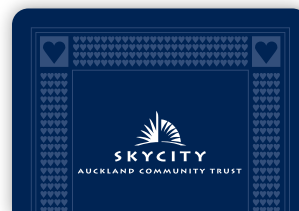

ORGANISATION	RECIPIENT LIST DESCRIPTION	GRANTED AMOUNT
Adventure Specialties Trust	The Adventure Specialties Trust provides adventure activities, outdoor pursuits and wilderness education to community groups and schools with the aim of facilitating the holistic development of individuals and families through the medium of the outdoors. A grant was made to subsidise the participation of 15 teenagers on its programme called "The Journey". This is a 10 day journey of self-discovery through team and individual challenges.	15,000.00
Age Concern North Shore	The Prescott Club comes under the umbrella of Age Concern North Shore, and is a weekly luncheon club for elderly. Up to 70 members attend each week, ranging in age from 77 to 95 years, and for most of the members, this may be their only opportunity for interacting with others. Funds have been awarded to cover the cost of the 2,500+ meals and transport the club provides each year.	5,000.00
Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy Inc	The Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy utilises the special relationship between horses and humans to motivate and change the attitudes and behaviour of at-risk youth and to help improve the lives of those with physical, emotional and intellectual disabilities. A grant has been made to assist with an urgent maintenance project to refurbish its building's four toilet facilities.	20,000.00
Aotearoa Young Peoples Theatre Trust (Massive Company)	Massive Company is a theatre company that assists young performers and emerging artists. It works to provide accessible entry to the performing arts to a diverse audience. Funds were awarded to provide free theatre workshops led by experienced theatre practitioners to young people 15 to 25 years old in South Auckland.	12,562.00
Arthritis New Zealand - Northern Region	Arthritis New Zealand - Northern Region aims to improve health and well-being for people affected by arthritis. A grant was made to assist a new initiative, Paediatric Rheumatology Programme (PRP), which will work closely with Kids with Arthritis support groups throughout the North Island. The aim of the PRP is to provide support for children and adolescents affected by arthritis, now 1 in 1,000 children. This will be achieved by offering individual education sessions and talks for children, their families and teachers and the launching of a series of courses "Living a Healthy Life" for adolescents.	10,000.00
Asia New Zealand Foundation	The aim of the Asia New Zealand Foundation is to build and sustain New Zealanders' knowledge and understanding of the countries, peoples, cultures and languages of Asia so they can develop more extensive and effective economic and cultural relationships in the region. Funds were awarded for the security component of the 11th Auckland Chinese Lantern Festival in 2010.	25,000.00
Auckland Chinese Community Centre	The Auckland Chinese Community Centre is a community-based organisation directed at the local Chinese community. Funds have been approved for venue hire for the 2010 Chinese New Year festival and Market Day at ASB Showgrounds. This is a free event consisting of a cultural concert of about four-hours in duration and a market consisting of around 250 stalls.	8,500.00
Auckland City Mission	The Auckland City Mission provides excellent social services and advocacy to marginalised people all over Auckland. The Calder Centre offers medical care to the City Mission clients and the general public who cannot afford to go to a doctor or who don't know how to go about finding one. It operates five days a week from their drop-in centre in Hobson Street. Funds have been granted for the purchase of vital equipment for this medical centre.	8,899.04
Auckland Community Theatre Trust Inc	The Auckland Community Theatre Trust aims to promote the performing arts within the Auckland region. Each year, it runs an awards competition for school productions with an awards evening. A grant has been awarded to assist with venue hire and associated costs so that ticket costs can be kept to a minimum to enable low-decile schools to attend.	7,000.00

Auckland Multicultural Society Inc	The aim of this society is to foster cultural awareness and unity among the ethnic groups of the Greater Auckland area. Funds have been approved to assist with staging a Multicultural Expo where 20 ethnic groups can promote their own society to increase their membership.	2,110.00
Auckland Netball Centre	Founded in 1911, the Auckland Netball Centre's long-term aim is to continue to provide facilities, administration, promotion and development of netball as an amateur game at grassroots level for all those who wish to participate. A grant was awarded to assist with installing a rubber system on the outdoor courts at Ngahue Reserve. Applying a rubber overlay on the existing courts will more than double the life of the courts.	100,000.00
Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra	The Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra exists to enliven and enrich the lives of Aucklanders through orchestral music. Funds were awarded for The Creation Project, where appropriate community groups will be approached and invited to experience the development of an orchestral project through integrated workshops, culminating with the provision of tickets to Haydn's great oratorio, The Creation.	30,500.00
Auckland Regional Migrant Services	The Auckland Regional Migrant Service provides advice, advocacy, information and guidance on a range of settlement services to refugees and migrants across the Auckland region. Funds have been awarded to assist with the ReactNow programme that provides targeted employment assistance for refugees. Improved employment outcomes benefits the individuals, their families and their communities.	30,000.00
Auckland Regional Rescue Helicopter (ARHT)	The Auckland Rescue Helicopter is a life-saving air ambulance service that is provided free of charge to its patients, their families and the Greater Auckland community. Under NZ Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) rules, the aircraft manufacturer's maintenance manuals have scheduled inspections every 50 hours. A grant has been approved to assist with the helicopter inspections and maintenance so that this service is able to maintain high standards for the public of Auckland.	90,000.00
Auckland Sexual Abuse Help	The vision of Auckland Sexual Abuse Help is to work towards a society where relationships are based on co-operation and respect, and free from sexual violence. A grant was awarded for the production of a guidebook for caregivers and parents supporting a young person through their disclosure of sexual abuse. These books will be available to parents and counsellors through its Youth Outreach programme in schools.	15,000.00
Blackmaid Productions	Blackmaid Productions is a community theatre group promoting African culture in New Zealand through theatre and performing arts with its aim to make African Theatre part of the Auckland community. Funds were granted to assist with the production of their play, His Excellency is in Love.	6,637.00
Books in Prison Trust	Funding has been awarded to the Books in Prison Trust to continue their publishing programme at the South Auckland Women's Prison. This rehabilitative programme has enabled women to learn about the publishing process and has developed learning and skills experience for real employment opportunities for the outside world.	10,000.00
Bring it on Trust	Bring It On is a high-energy, primarily Hip Hop focused dance event that is run for secondary schools within Auckland. This is its seventh year, and a grant has been approved to assist with the production costs of this event.	25,000.00
Brothers in Arms Charitable Trust	Brothers In Arms Charitable Trust exists to bring hope and change to young Kiwis through one-on-one mentoring. Working with Te Waipuna and the Auckland Women's Centre, it is establishing a Teen Parent Mentor programme. Funding was awarded to assist this pilot programme that will enable 12 teen parents to be matched with 12 adult mentors living in their local community for a 12-month programme.	16,000.00
Camp Bentzon (Kawau Island) Trust	Camp Bentzon offers a special land and marine-based location for camp-goers to experience the outdoors environment. The camp is booked out 48 weeks a year including weekends, catering for approximately 32 schools a year with a total of 5,000 children and adults. A grant has been approved to repaint the accommodation and dining areas which are showing signs of excessive wear and damage.	10,000.00
Cancer Society of New Zealand Auckland Division Inc	The Cancer Society of NZ Auckland Division is the leading non-government organisation dedicated to reducing the incidence of cancer and ensuring the best cancer care for everyone in the Greater Auckland and Northland region. Funding has been granted to enable them to print and distribute the SunSmart Schools Curriculum Resource to schools that are SunSmart accredited. The resource has been piloted with 10 schools (200 teachers) and is now ready to be updated and distributed across the Auckland and Northland regions.	20,000.00
Chinese New Settlers Services Trust	The mission of the Chinese New Settlers Services Trust is to improve the quality of life of Chinese New Zealanders and to facilitate the successful integration of Chinese new settlers into the wider New Zealand society. A grant has been awarded to assist with updating the information in the Chinese version of the Road User Guide, which is a source of information about New Zealand road rules, licensing issues, New Zealand driving culture and many other road-safety issues.	13,000.00
Christians against Poverty	Christians Against Poverty is an international debt-counselling charity with an 80% success rate in the provision of sustainable debt relief. It does not distribute money, or provide loans, but empowers people to live within their means through education and a range of specialist services. The first Centres were opened in New Zealand a year ago, and they have assisted 524 people out of poverty. Funding has been approved towards their annual Awards Dinner in November, to encourage clients through three recognition awards.	19,000.00
Coast Youth Community Trust	The Coast Youth Community Trust works with and implements key strategies that positively affect the lives of youth and families in the Rodney District. Funding has been awarded to subsidise camp fees for two camps being run this year. The camps are targeted primarily for youth identified through schools and the local community as being 'at risk'. The camps will provide a forum for youth to be challenged and positively influenced. They will include adventure-based activities where the young people are being developed through positive risk-taking, team-building, and by developing leadership and ownership.	3,900.00

Counselling Services Centre	The Counselling Services Centre has a crisis team that responds to calls from the Police 24/7, providing support and assistance to victims of sexual assault and to their whanau. A grant has been approved for the purchase of prepaid phone-cards for the after-hours crisis team of six. In the current climate, the Centre is becoming busier and respond to an increased number of calls from the Police. The crisis staff have prepaid phones so that they can remain in contact with the Police, hospitals and other social services.	1,000.00
CPS	The focus and purpose of CPS is to prevent harm to children and prevent children from dying from violence and abuse. It achieves this by educating those who work with children about how to recognise and respond to child abuse. Funds have been approved to run two Child Protection Studies programmes in the Auckland region in 2009.	10,000.00
Dayspring Trust	The Dayspring Trust provides programmes that address the issues of neglect and abuse within multi-stressed families. A grant has been awarded towards its anger management recovery programme, which is the second of a four-stage approach that brings healing to adults who suffer the long-term effects of abuse, neglect and trauma. These programmes benefit the community by contributing towards violence prevention, improving parenting skills, keeping children safe and promoting positive mental health.	6,200.00
De Paul House	De Paul House provides the only emergency/transitional housing in the North Shore/Rodney area. Funds have been approved for the replacement of the 25-year old telephone system and the installation of a heat pump in the meeting room which is used constantly for meetings with families, WINZ, and Child Youth & Family (CYF) in which to run the Living Skills programme.	7,075.75
Ethiopian Sport & Cultural Club	The Ethiopian Sport and Cultural Club supports Ethiopian newcomers and refugees who have made New Zealand their home. A grant has been awarded for the purchase of resources for running a holiday programme for school-children and towards hall hire for upcoming cultural events.	6,000.00
Foundation for Alcohol and Drug Education (FADE)	FADE provides up-to-date education, training and resources for New Zealand secondary schools. Funding has been granted to reprint 20,000 copies of a quality six-page brochure entitled "Drugs, The Brain and Your Mental Health", which is an essential brochure for schools.	5,773.32
Friendship Centre Trust	The Friendship Centre Trust has been awarded funding for its long-term supported social housing pilot project which provides affordable housing to low-income families. The project will assist in purchasing a further 10 properties to continue to address the community's need for affordable housing, ensuring improved long-term outcomes for families.	50,000.00
Friendship House	Friendship House has received a grant to assist with the costs of self-referred men completing the Living Without Violence programme. The recent national media campaign, It's Not OK, has resulted in an increase in men wishing to voluntarily attend the Living Without Violence programmes. This funding will assist 15 men who cannot afford the fees to attend the programme.	20,000.00
Garden to Table Trust	The Garden to Table Trust has been established to facilitate a programme in New Zealand schools where children aged 7 to 10 years will learn to grow, harvest, prepare and share food. Through this programme, children spend time each week in an extensive vegetable garden which they have helped design, build and maintain on the school grounds. They also spend time each week in a sustainably-run kitchen classroom preparing and sharing meals created from their produce. Funding has been awarded to assist with programme development, including the cost of affiliation to the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Foundation and the supply of manuals.	30,000.00
Girl Guides Assn of New Zealand Inc	Te Ropu Tamariki is an after-school club that teaches basic life and social skills to children in 11 low-decile schools throughout the Auckland region. It currently reaches up to 240 children, with more than 75% of children not able to participate in extracurricular activities outside of school. Each year, it runs approximately 35 programmes including four outings to places of interest. A grant was approved to assist with activities, outings, equipment and training.	10,000.00
Great Potentials Foundation	Since 1990, the Great Potentials Foundation has developed and introduced programmes to help New Zealand children, young people and families to flourish. Funds have been approved for resources needed for the Home Interaction Programme for Parents and Youngsters (HIPPY) in Otahuhu. Its goal is for 70 Otahuhu families to participate in HIPPY which is a home-based programme that helps parents create experiences for their children that lay the foundations for success in school and later life. The programme was designed specifically for those parents who may not feel comfortable with their own abilities to teach their children.	30,000.00
Grey Lynn Park Festival Trust	This trust is responsible for organising the annual Grey Lynn Park Festival. The festival has run for 25 years and funds have been awarded to contribute towards the Whanau Stage and updated signage.	10,000.00
Harmoni Koula'o Atalanga	This Tongan brass band has been awarded funding for the purchase of musical instruments. Many of its young participants come from families that cannot afford to provide musical instruments. This brass band enables young people to actively participate in the arts, giving them something productive to do and keeping them off the streets.	20,000.00
Helensville Women & Family Centre	The Helensville Women and Family Centre has been operating in the area for 16 years and provides core services - counselling, family support, parenting courses, self-development courses, youth programmes, and health/wellness programmes. The current economic recession has resulted in an increased demand on its counselling service. Funds have been approved to subsidise counselling fees for those who are unable to pay the cost themselves.	20,000.00
Henderson Budget Service Inc	The Henderson Budget Service supports the community with money management skills and advice that will equip them with financial stability. Funding has been awarded to contribute towards the Youth project that aims to educate youth about debt, budgeting and money management.	30,000.00
Homebuilders Community Services Maungaturoto/Panmure Inc	Homebuilders Community Services empowers families in the Maungaturoto and Paparoa areas to create safe, nurturing environments. A grant has been made to provide emergency food parcels and to assist with the provision of Golden Oldies meals. This year the requests for assistance are beyond the capacity of the local resource.	4,080.00

Homes of Hope Charitable Trust	The Homes of Hope Trust provides safe, nurturing homes and therapeutic foster care for children who have experienced trauma, abuse or neglect. Its homes are unique in New Zealand and provide a long-term commitment for whole sibling groups whilst resolution is found for their families. Funds have been approved towards the purchase of furniture and whiteware for two new homes in Waitakere, Auckland.	23,810.65
Hope Unlimited Trust	The Hope Unlimited Trust provides professional and quality counselling on a sliding scale to the local Franklin community so that those on a lower income are not excluded from professional help. Approximately 3,570 people from the Franklin District benefit annually from its services. Funds were awarded to provide subsidised counselling for low-income families.	10,000.00
House of Bethany	The House of Bethany is a house for families who have not been able to take time out because of their situation, work commitments, financial and emotional stress, tiredness and inability to organise. A grant has been provided to assist with its annual costs and repairs and maintenance.	3,000.00
House of Spirit (Te Whare Wairua) Trust	Since 2005, the House of Spirit Trust has been providing counselling and self-development programmes on marae's for Maori people who would not otherwise seek conventional assistance. In the past, the individuals have paid for these programmes themselves. Numbers are now declining as people can no longer afford the payment. Funds were awarded to provide assistance for these programmes over the next 12 months.	15,000.00
Huntington's Disease Assn Auckland Inc	Huntington's Disease Association Auckland provides support to people suffering from this disease, their families and carers. Funding has been approved towards establishing a website which will help keep families informed, as well as giving others in the community an opportunity to support those with the disease.	3,650.00
Kauri Coast Community Pool Trust	Funds have been awarded to the Kauri Coast Community Pool Trust to contribute to the building of a 50-metre swimming pool. This will provide all sectors of the community the opportunity to engage in a variety of water-based recreational activities, ensure all residents and visitors can gain aquatic skills and participate in recreational activities and fitness. The current pool was built in 1918 and is leaking inwards and outwards - it is the only public facility available in the Kaipara area.	50,000.00
Kidz Social Services	Kidz Social Services provides counsellors for local primary-aged children within schools. Success in the classroom is essential for a child's future development and can be compromised by worries from home. Funding was granted to subsidise this counselling so that the costs to parents and/or the school are minimised.	20,000.00
Koru Care Charitable Trust New Zealand	Koru Care New Zealand aims to make dreams come true for seriously ill, disabled and severely disadvantaged children. Its main activities involve taking these children on overseas trips to the Gold Coast and Los Angeles. A grant has been approved to support a trip to Los Angeles for special needs children.	16,000.00
Leukaemia & Blood Foundation	The Leukaemia and Blood Foundation is New Zealand's leading resource of information for patients and their families, affected by leukaemia, lymphoma, myeloma and related blood conditions. Funding has been awarded towards the translation of their current disease-specific information booklets into Simplified Chinese.	17,000.00
Life Education Trust Auckland Central Inc	Life Education Trust Auckland Central has recently expanded to two mobile classrooms. Funding was awarded for a replacement branded vehicle which is used extensively for school programme work, sponsor and supporter projects and fundraising initiatives.	10,000.00
Life Education Trust Manukau South	Life Education Trust is a non-profit organisation dedicated to delivering an interactive health programme as part of the school curriculum to primary and intermediate schoolchildren each year. Life Education Manukau South is newly established and will service the Greater Manurewa area, with 10,522 primary/intermediate school children from 24 schools. Funds have been granted to contribute towards the refurbishment of the mobile classroom that has been donated by another branch.	10,000.00
Life Education Trust North Shore	Life Education Trust North Shore provides young people of the North Shore with a health-based education programme with the knowledge and skills to raise their awareness to live fulfilling and healthy lives. Funding is sought for the educator's salary to support the ongoing project of providing programmes which help children to reach their full potential.	10,000.00
LIFEWISE (Methodist Mission Northern)	LIFEWISE is the name for the community and social services division of Methodist Mission Northern. Funds were awarded to support the provision of a meal programme that is the first point of engagement with long-term chronically homeless individuals. This contact has the aim of assisting homeless people into permanent and sustainable housing.	10,000.00
Look Good Feel Better	Look Good Feel Better offers a free service to women undergoing treatment for cancer. Its aim is to help restore and enhance the appearance of the cancer patients both during and after treatment. It offers guidance, information and makeover expertise at special workshops throughout New Zealand. A grant has been approved for the printing of brochures and newsletters to be used in the Greater Auckland area to advertise its workshops and showcase the work of its organisation.	5,000.00
Make-A-Wish New Zealand	The ultimate objective of Make-A-Wish is to ensure every New Zealand child with a life-threatening illness will have the opportunity to be granted a wish. Funds have been awarded to contribute to a Wish Pool, which will assist with the funding of selected wishes in the Auckland area.	20,000.00
Manukau City Orchestral Society Inc	The Manukau Symphony Orchestra has received funding for a combined concert project 'Yellow River' - featuring the orchestra and Music Association of Auckland, to be performed in December 2009 at Telstra Clear Events Centre. The purpose of this project is to bring the two community groups closer by performing a landmark Chinese work.	5,000.00

Manukau Pacific Island Trust	The Manukau Pacific Island Trust has been operating for 17 years and facilitate a number of educational programmes including practical life-skills such as cooking, sewing and Pacific Island traditional craft, parenting skills and community-based initiatives to promote healthy, happy and harm-free families. Funds have been awarded to assist with volunteer expenses, training and supervision costs, administration, advertising and telephone expenses.	11,500.00
Masada Community Trust	The Masada Community Trust runs a special-needs learning and recreation centre offering programmes for able and disabled children and young adults. It offers vocational training programmes, holiday care and respite services. Funding has been awarded for its Break-through programme, aimed at young people at risk of offending and susceptible to influences such as drug use.	25,000.00
Maungarei Community Christian Trust	Funding has been approved as a contribution towards its Kia Mahi Tahī (Working as One) project. This initiative employs community youth workers to work with young people aged from 6 to 18 years that have been identified as being 'at risk'. The youth workers provide positive mentoring and may include courses that deal with such aspects as anger management, social interaction, behaviour management, sports coaching, chaplaincy and youth advocacy.	9,708.32
Mighty Mouth Community Trust	The Mighty Mouth Charitable Trust provides workforce development in the oral health sector and supports activities in secondary schools that promote oral health awareness. It provides on-site dental services at 20 secondary schools in South Auckland and in 2008 provided services to 14,489 students. As it operates within low-decile populations, patients often have no transport to attend the follow-up care. Funds have been awarded to purchase a people-mover vehicle so that students can be transported for follow-up care at a Mighty Mouth practice.	25,000.00
Migrant Action Trust	The Migrant Action Trust is a non-profit charitable trust established in 2003 to develop meaningful employment of migrants and refugees to safeguard their well-being and healthy integration into New Zealand. Funding has been approved to contribute towards a project called "Employment and Life Skills Support Groups: Migrants helping migrants and their families". The aim of the project is to offer support to unemployed or under-employed migrants in four main areas: prevention and detection of mental health issues, families, life-skills and job-seeking skills.	10,000.00
Monte Cecilia Housing Trust	The Monte Cecilia Housing Trust has been operating as an emergency housing provider in Auckland for over 26 years. In 2008, it provided 4,000 nights of emergency accommodation and assisted over 90 families to find long-term sustainable housing. A grant has been awarded to support its Waitakere Housing Service.	25,000.00
Motatau Marae Trustees	The Motatau Marae is a small, rural, isolated marae that is striving to add value to its own and surrounding communities. Funding has been granted to develop a sound, light and multi-faceted entertainment system in the new dining room so that the complex, particularly the stage, can be utilised for presentations, entertainment, tourist attractions and a host of other activities that will allow the marae to be semi-self sustainable.	30,000.00
Mt Richmond Special School	Mt Richmond Special School is a State school for students with intellectual disabilities, aged 5 to 21 years, in a low-decile multi-cultural area. Funding has been approved to enable its students to attend Riding for the Disabled. This gives an opportunity for the students' development in areas such as balance, muscle strength and flexibility, along with an improvement in self-esteem, confidence and the ability to multi-task.	5,000.00
Museum of Transport & Technology (MOTAT)	MOTAT was established in 1964 and holds many significant and iconic artefacts. Funds have been awarded to provide four security cameras for the area which houses the Museum's textile collection of adult and children's garments, patchwork and embroidery. The area is humidity controlled and equipped with a fire detection system. Given the uniqueness and historical significance of the collection, a video security system is required.	3,296.00
New Zealand - Sri Lanka Forced Migrants' Support Group	This support group assists Sri Lankan refugees and forced migrants who have been living in New Zealand to settle and integrate in New Zealand culture. Funds have been approved for a programme starting in October 2009 for 25 households and 20 volunteers that will touch on a number of subjects including a community awareness workshop, career guidance workshop, health and nutritional food making, vocational training, parenting skills, social events and field trips, budgeting, yoga and meditation.	10,000.00
New Zealand Dance Festival	Funding has been awarded towards the continuation of the SKYCITY Golden Ticket Initiative as part of Tempo, New Zealand's Festival of Dance. This initiative provides 1,900 free tickets to the elderly, disabled and Decile 1, 2 and 3 schools in the Auckland region.	30,000.00
New Zealand Heritage Trust	The New Zealand Heritage Trust aims to foster a better appreciation of New Zealand's building heritage by educating the public, promoting recognition and protection of heritage buildings. Funds were approved to establish a comprehensive website of its activities, the work that is carried out and to create a catalogue of building information. This initiative is seen as one of the most important ways of connecting with the public and enabling people to understand more about heritage and the laws that govern its protection.	25,000.00
New Zealand National Maritime Museum	The purpose of the National Maritime Museum is to preserve, present and portray New Zealand's maritime heritage. Funding has been awarded to identify, catalogue and index over 350,000 photographs, slides, glass plates and negatives housed by the Museum. These items are not currently accessible as they have not been catalogued or indexed.	20,000.00
New Zealand Youth Choir (Choirs Aotearoa New Zealand Trust)	The New Zealand Youth Choir consists of the best choral singers nationally. It has been in existence for three years and is known nationally and internationally for unparalleled excellence and success. A grant has been approved to enable the choir to perform public and education concerts in Auckland and Warkworth.	11,607.00
North Rodney Blue Light Ventures Inc	New Zealand Blue Light Ventures is a community and Police initiative which aims to reduce the incidence of young people becoming offenders or victims of crime, as well as encouraging better relationships between the Police, young people, their parents and the community. Funding has been awarded to replace existing water safety equipment and to purchase a new 'pop-up' gazebo.	4,500.00
