<b>Affirming Works</b>	Affirming Works is an innovative Pacific organisation that offers an extensive range of youth mentoring and educational services to various communities within the Auckland region. These mentoring programmes are culturally appropriate, interactive and adaptable to the target group. Funding has been approved for the ongoing delivery of its Alumni Programme that encourages the professional and personal development of youth 17-24 years who are no longer at school.	20,000.00
<b>Afghan Association of NZ</b>	The Afghan Association of NZ's focus and purpose is to promote better communication and liaison between the people of Afghanistan and New Zealand. Funding has been approved to assist with maintenance of Afghan women's art and handcraft through the purchase of three sewing machines, an overlocker and art and craft materials.	5,000.00
<b>Age Concern Counties Manukau</b>	Age Concern Counties Manukau strives to enhance the health and wellbeing of older people by promoting quality-assured activity, information, support and advice. The issue of recurring frustration for older people to attend to small jobs around the home is especially true if they do not have family or friends readily available. The Handyman Fieldworker service utilises a certified electrician with a geriatric nursing background to attend to small tasks such as hanging pictures, changing smoke-alarm batteries and lightbulbs, replacing hinges and any other odd jobs. Funding has been approved towards the salary, tools and equipment needed for the Handyman Fieldworker service.	5,000.00
<b>Albany CoCo</b>	Albany CoCo is the key anchor organisation in Albany, working to make the community a great place to live, work and play. Research shows that Albany's rapid growth has not been matched with services and facilities. Funding has been approved to employ a project manager to oversee three vital community projects over six months: Albany Newcomers Network, The Albany Youth Forum and a pre-school playgroup.	3,000.00
<b>Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy</b>	Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy provides therapeutic riding, educational and learning services to mainly young people, with a wide range of difficulties and/or disabilities. The Centre has two classroom blocks and both are in urgent need of new roofing and guttering. The roofs have been patched previously but are now leaking and requiring replacement. Funding has been approved to assist with the provision of a new roof and guttering for the Centre.	20,000.00
<b>Amitabha Hospice Services Trust</b>	The purpose of Amitabha Hospice is to offer free practical home help and compassionate companionship from the time a person is diagnosed with a life-limiting illness or condition. Amitabha Hospice receives referrals of individuals without adequate family supports that need more practical help and companionship than is available from other agencies or social welfare. Funding has been provided to purchase petrol voucher for volunteers.	2,000.00
<b>Anglican Trust for Women and Children</b>	Anglican Trust for Women and Children's services are aimed at strengthening the capacity of parents / caregivers in their parenting and caregiving roles. Funding has been approved for the organisation's Gladiators of Change Programme. This is specifically for Pasifika parents and promotes positive parenting while allowing parents to explore different aspects of their own parenting that otherwise is not validated.	3,000.00



<b>Aotearoa Young People's Theatre Trust (Massive Company)</b>	Massive Company is an Auckland based ensemble theatre company, working with young people, emerging artists and professional practitioners to create access and opportunities for a diverse range of people to engage with contemporary New Zealand theatre. Funds have been awarded to contribute towards venue rental and tutor fees for the delivery of free Theatre workshops for young and emerging artists.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Arthritis New Zealand</b>	Arthritis New Zealand's aim is to improve health and wellbeing of people who are affected by arthritis which is the single greatest cause of physical disability in this country. Funding has been approved to purchase a vehicle for the Arthritis Educator in Auckland and surrounding areas.	<b>15,000.00</b>
<b>Arts Therapy NZ Trust</b>	Arts Therapy NZ Trust works to support a healthy community through creativity by providing arts therapy services and programmes to children, adolescents and their families. Creativity programmes, art workshops and the creative arts therapies are provided for groups and individuals for any number of emotional, psychological or behavioural concerns. Funding has been approved to assist with the purchase of materials needed for one year of providing therapeutic services and arts therapy programmes to clients.	<b>3,000.00</b>
<b>Asia New Zealand Foundation</b>	The aim of Asia New Zealand Foundation is to build and sustain New Zealanders' understanding of the countries, peoples, cultures and language of Asia so they can develop more extensive and effective economic and cultural relationships in the region. Funding has been approved to contribute towards security costs for the annual Auckland Chinese Lantern Festival.	<b>7,500.00</b>
<b>Auckland &amp; District Pipe Band</b>	The Auckland & District Pipe Band fosters the art of piping and drumming at the highest possible level. The bands last refresh of their uniform was back in 1998 and so much of it is now quite old and in a state of disrepair. Funding has been awarded to contribute towards the update of Band uniform.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Choral Society</b>	Auckland Choral is a choir of volunteer singers who are now professionally auditioned, voiced and coached, to produce a sound that is of symphonic quality. Annually, they provide one free concert and will partner again with the Auckland Chinese community in performances with the Music Association Auckland Chorus and the Manukau Symphony Orchestra. Funding has been awarded to assist with the venue hire for rehearsals.	<b>8,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland City Mission</b>	Auckland City Mission provides targeted, effective social services to marginalised people in Auckland. Funds have been approved to help refurbish the Crisis Care Centre.	<b>3,500.00</b>
<b>Auckland Community Theatre</b>	The Auckland Community Theatre Trust promotes the performing arts within the Auckland region. Each year, they organise an awards competition for school productions and hold an Oscar-style awards evening. Funding has been approved to assist with theatre hire and associated costs for the awards evening so that the entry fee for schools is kept to a minimum.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland District Kidney Society</b>	The Kidney Society delivers critical early intervention social services to patients and families affected by kidney failure. Funding has been approved to assist services delivered to pre-Dialysis patients (those that are experiencing kidney failure but are not yet on dialysis). It is critical that these patients and families receive the correct support and advocacy in preparation for the commencement of dialysis.	<b>20,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Down Syndrome Association</b>	The Auckland Down Syndrome Association is a parent-based organisation located in Auckland that provides support to the parents of children and young adults with Down Syndrome. Funds have been awarded to assist with an online library functionality which needs to be developed to support a new education resources lending library for the community.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Festival of Photography Trust</b>	Auckland Festival of Photography Trust seeks to promote photography as an artform and as an accessible vehicle for artistic expression for all Aucklanders. The Toulouse Photography Festival in France and the Auckland Festival of Photography are partnering in a cultural exhibition exchange. In May, the Toulouse Festival will exhibit images from the Auckland Photo Day competition. In exchange, an exhibition of the work of Toulouse photographer, Guillaume Riviere, will take place at the Aotea Gallery, free of charge to the public. Funding has been approved to print and mount photographs for this initiative.	<b>2,500.00</b>
<b>Auckland Land Search and Rescue</b>	Auckland Land Search and Rescue is a volunteer organisation that provides a professional search and rescue resource and capability to the NZ Police to search for and rescue people who become lost in their urban, rural or wilderness environments. Funding has been approved to help refurbish WandaTrak tracking pendants which are issued to people living with dementia, autism, brain injury or IHC who have a tendency to wander, run away from their place of residence and become lost.	<b>3,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Latin American Community</b>	The purpose of the Auckland Latin American Community is to preserve, enhance and promote the positive aspects of the culture of Spain and Latin America. Funding has been approved to contribute towards costs associated with writing and executing short plays in Spanish.	<b>8,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Museum</b>	Auckland Museum has received funding for a pilot project that seeks to increase accessibility and engagement to the diverse communities that make up Auckland. This will be done by reducing transport costs for low decile schools to attend Aqua, an internationally acclaimed experience that takes you on a journey into the world of water.	<b>20,000.00</b>

<b>Auckland Music Theatre</b>	Auckland Music Theatre has a proud 92-year history of providing Aucklanders with high quality theatrical entertainment. In September 2011, they are staging a production of 'Anything Goes' at The Civic. Funding has been awarded to help provide an Audio Describer for blind audience members and a Sign Language Interpreter for deaf audience members. This will make the production available to as much of the community as possible.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra</b>	The Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra exists to enliven and enrich the lives of Aucklanders through orchestral music. Funding has been approved to assist with orchestral wages for 'Jellybean: The Concert', two free concerts that will be seen by more than 3,000 children and parents. 'Jellybean' is a popular and recently reprinted children's book written by Tessa Duder that tells the story of a young girl, whose mother plays in an Auckland orchestra, and who yearns to be a conductor.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Presbyterian Hospital Trustees Inc (St Andrews Village)</b>	St Andrew's Village, situated in Glendowie, provides a high quality residential hospital, rest home and dementia care for older people. Funds have been awarded to purchase a Guldmann GH3 ceiling hoist system and a general purpose super sling for a hospital room. Because the system operates from rails on the ceiling the resident can be easily moved around the room unhindered by furniture; storage is not a problem and the system is available whenever required.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Regional Migrant Services (ARMS) Charitable Trust</b>	ARMS Charitable Trust facilitates the successful settlement and integration of migrants and returning kiwis into Auckland - through effective regional coordination, community networking, delivery of specialist services and informed advocacy. Funding has been received to coordinate the ongoing IT web project settlement.org.nz website for newcomers.	<b>25,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Rescue Helicopter Trust</b>	Auckland Rescue Helicopter Trust is a life-saving air ambulance and rescue service that is provided free of charge to its patients, their families and the Greater Auckland community. In late 2010, a brand new Toyota Rav4 vehicle was sponsored to be used by the paramedics as a Rapid Response Vehicle. Funding has been approved to help equip this vehicle with all the necessary medical equipment to make it fully functional.	<b>30,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Symphony Orchestra</b>	The Auckland Symphony Orchestra is a community based orchestra that provides an opportunity for musicians who have chosen a profession outside of music, to continue to play and perform. Funds have been awarded to help purchase sound shells which enables the sound to be projected out into the theatre instead of it disappearing out into the wings and back stage.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Women's Centre</b>	Auckland Women's Centre facilitates the empowerment and wellbeing of women. Funding has been awarded for a low cost counselling project, including immediate care provided by the Information, Referral and Advice Service. Last year, 13,300 clients used the Information, Referral and Advice Service with 517 of these women receiving one-on-one counselling through this project.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Women's Refuge</b>	Auckland Women's Refuge provides confidential 24-hour emergency domestic violence intervention accommodation for families. Funding has been approved to support four Christchurch refuges by taking Domestic Violence families out of the area to keep safe and help reestablish new lives in the Auckland area.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Auckland Young Womens Christian Assn Inc (YWCA)</b>	The YWCA Auckland supports and nurtures women toward greater strength, confidence and success by providing resources, opportunities and guidance to enable them to reach their full potential. Future Leaders fills a gap in mentoring and skills-based services to young people. It differs from other programmes as it is long term (4-5 years), it focusses on the individual, is closely monitored and concentrates on women only. Funding has been approved to assist with the costs of the Future Leaders programme.	<b>30,000.00</b>
<b>Balatino Dance Club</b>	Balatino Dance Club is based in Christchurch and provides opportunities for dancers to enhance their skills and where possible assist them to participate in competitions. The Dancesport Nationals competition was to be held in Christchurch and was relocated to Auckland due to the earthquake. Many dancers have been financially impacted by the earthquake and are unable to afford to come to the competition in Auckland. Funding has been approved to assist with travel, accommodation and van hire to attend the Dancesport Nationals.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Bays Youth Community Trust</b>	Bays Youth Community Trust exists to support youth, schools and families through adventure based learning, mentoring and social support. Their projects include life-skill programmes and mentoring. Funding has been approved to contribute towards youth life-skill programmes and mentoring.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Bhartiya Samaj Charitable Trust</b>	Bhartiya Samaj Charitable Trust helps and assists people of Indian origin in settling down suitably in New Zealand in all walks of life. Every year, they organise an India Independence Day celebration where several thousand people of all ethnicity come and participate. Funding has been approved to contribute towards costs associated with this event.	<b>8,000.00</b>
<b>Bring It On Trust</b>	The Bring It On Trust has been running mentoring programmes in over 33 secondary schools across Auckland for eight years. Partnering with the Bring It On Dance Competition, the mentoring programme reaches out to over 1,800 students. This dance competition is held over three heats with a massive grand final. Funds have been approved to assist with the costs associated with the Bring it On Dance competition.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Carlson School for Cerebral Palsy</b>	Carlson School for Cerebral Palsy caters for students with severe physical and neurological impairments. Funding has been awarded to provide Musical Therapy for students. Sessions are provided by a registered Music Therapist and are individualised to the specific needs of students.	<b>25,000.00</b>

<b>Centre City Music Theatre</b>	Centre City Music Theatre provides an environment of the highest quality tuition and support for the advancement of drama, dance and voice. They provide accessible professional training to a diverse group of students who are passionate about furthering their theatre performance skills. A Summer School and Senior Workshops are held for two weeks in January and funding has been awarded to assist with the venue costs for these events.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Challenge Trust</b>	Challenge Trust was established in 1993 and now has more than 300 staff providing recovery-oriented services to more than 2,000 people affected by mental illness, mental impairment, physical disability, dementia, eating disorders and drug and alcohol issues. Funding has been approved to implement the 'Well Woman' programme in the Manukau and South Auckland area. The project addresses key elements of wellness, confidence and self-esteem of women who are vulnerable to pressures of community and family life.	<b>24,000.00</b>
<b>Child Matters</b>	Child Matters is New Zealand's specialist child abuse prevention organisation. Funding has been approved to support the cost of running a 5-day Child Protection Studies Programme in Auckland in 2011. For the past 16 years, Child Matters has been providing this essential training for people working with children. Child Matters training imparts crucial skills and knowledge on how to recognise, intervene and stop child abuse.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Children's Bible Ministries</b>	Children's Bible Ministries run Camp Raglan which is frequented by many families and school groups each year. Funding has been approved to contribute towards the replacement of windows at the north-facing boys dormitories.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Chinese Association of West Auckland</b>	Chinese Association of West Auckland runs weekly English classes for new migrants at the New Lynn Community Centre with about 80 participants in each class. Funding has been approved to assist with venue hire costs for these classes.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Chinese Language Foundation</b>	Chinese Language Foundation promotes and supports the study of Chinese in New Zealand schools. Funds have been awarded for a Chinese Language and Culture Day which is a specially designed and modelled extracurricular programme for primary and intermediate school students not of Chinese descent, who are studying Chinese as part of their school curriculum. These students will use what they have learned to interact with Chinese speaking volunteers in a variety of traditional Chinese folk activities.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Chinese New Settlers Services Trust</b>	The mission of Chinese New Settlers Services Trust is to improve the quality of life of Chinese New Zealanders. Funds have been awarded to translate the New Zealand road code and print a translated License & Study Guide for Chinese migrants.	<b>7,500.00</b>
<b>Choice Foundation Charitable Trust</b>	CHOICE (Children Have Opportunities In Careers and Education) Foundation Charitable Trust manages and develops the StandTall Programme which had previously run under the umbrella of KidsCan Charitable Trust. StandTall is a preventative, capability enhancement programme for children who show great potential but have limited resources / knowledge / opportunity to ever reach that potential. Funding has been approved to contribute towards longitudinal research of the StandTall programme to determine how well the programme is working.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Chronic Fatigue Syndrome and Fibromyalgia New Zealand</b>	Chronic Fatigue Syndrome & Fibromyalgia NZ aims to educate medical professionals, provide services to sufferers and raise awareness within the community. Both illnesses have been long misunderstood and are commonly misdiagnosed. Funding has been approved to contribute towards operational expenses.	<b>3,000.00</b>
<b>Cochlear Implant Foundation of New Zealand (The Hearing House)</b>	The Hearing House was established after ear, nose and throat surgeons and parents of deaf children became concerned that profoundly deaf children with cochlear implants were not learning to listen and speak like their hearing friends. The Hearing House is considered a pioneer not only in its provision of Auditory-Verbal Therapy but also in that it regularly measures children's progress on their journey to learn how to listen and speak. Funds have been awarded to continue measuring progress and barriers to progress by launching a new Outcomes Research Project. This research has never been done before and the aim is to digitise all of The Hearing House's data and aggregate this information to see how well - or not - those children are doing and if any particular groups of children need more attention to ensure they are reaching their potential.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Combined Beneficiaries Union</b>	Combined Beneficiaries Union provides advisory and advocacy support to clients who are beneficiaries, low-paid employees, people with disabilities, and those suffering hardship, assisting them to obtain their correct entitlements and assisting them with budgetary advice. Funding has been approved to assist with staffing and administration costs.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Community Waitakere Charitable Trust</b>	Community Waitakere manages the Waitakere Community Resource Centre which provides low cost offices and meeting space for a range of community organisations. Funding has been awarded to purchase stackable chairs for this facility.	<b>3,480.00</b>
<b>Counselling Services Centre</b>	Counselling Services Centre provides free and low-cost counselling and a 24/7 crisis response service for victims of abuse and assault. Funding has been provided for the delivery of an 8-session group therapy programme at South Auckland High Schools called 'Regener8'. This programme caters for male and female adolescents aged 13-18 years and focuses on the effects of Domestic and Family Violence on young people, their friends, their school and the wider community.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>De La Salle College</b>	De La Salle College is a decile 1 College for boys in Mangere East, South Auckland. Funding has been approved to establish a Building and Construction Course for behaviour-deficient students at years 11 - 13. This course leads to employment or further study on completion.	<b>14,000.00</b>

<b>De Paul House</b>	De Paul House provides emergency housing and social work support for families in the North Shore/Rodney area. De Paul House provides the basic necessities of life and offers families a chance to achieve long term goals focussing on education, employment/training and social work support. Funding has been approved to assist with the costs of running the Learning Centre. This Centre offers families who have not accessed educational opportunities elsewhere a familiar and comfortable learning environment.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Diabetes Project Trust</b>	Diabetes Project Trust emphasises partnership with the community to achieve better health for present and future generations. One of their programmes is Gardens4Health where many of New Zealand's United Nations refugees annual allocation of 750 people now learn how to garden in New Zealand conditions. Funds have been awarded to assist with the provision of an updated garden starter kit resource which will include practical information, seed, plants, tools and equipment for 120 families as they go to their new homes.	<b>15,000.00</b>
<b>Dress for Success</b>	The global mission of Dress for Success is to promote the economic independence of disadvantaged women by providing professional attire, a network of support and the career development tools to help women thrive in work and life. Dress for Success provides free interview appropriate clothing and grooming advice to assist in building self esteem and feeling confident, thereby increasing their chances of success. Funding has been awarded to assist with the costs of a new service called Breakfast Club - Steps to Success. The objective of this initiative is to provide Dress for Success Auckland clients who have been dressed for an interview but have not yet entered the workforce, access to a networking group to support and provide tools to get a winning edge in the job market.	<b>10,000.00</b>
<b>Eating Difficulties Education Network (EDEN)</b>	EDEN provides community based services for people with eating difficulties. The focus over the years has shifted from a problem based service provision to include prevention and health promotion that recognises the interconnectedness of weight and size issues in all their forms. Funding has been awarded to subsidise counselling services for clients and to deliver the Body Image Leader Programme into five low decile schools.	<b>20,000.00</b>
<b>Enuamanu Atiu Nui-Maruarua Society</b>	The purpose of Enuamanu Atiu Nui-Maruarua Society is to provide cultural, religious, educational and sporting programmes to Cook Islands people. Funding has been approved to purchase two sewing machines to be used in the tie-dyeing workshop as part of the Cook Islands Culture in Festival which is aimed at showcasing and celebrating Cook Islands culture.	<b>1,500.00</b>
<b>Epsom Community Creche</b>	Epsom Community Creche is a small, not-for-profit community organisation, providing early childhood education services in Epsom. It has operated from its current site for over 20 years and is one of the few non-commercial centres that operate on a sessional basis. Funding has been approved to replace one existing sign on the front of the premises, and add an additional sign in the parking area.	<b>250.00</b>
<b>Ethiopian Sport &amp; Cultural Club</b>	Ethiopian Sport & Cultural Club provides activities to help and support Ethiopian newcomers and refugees to settle into New Zealand. The majority of Ethiopian families have low incomes and are unable to support the cost of these activities. Funds have been approved towards hall hire costs for a playgroup to get young families out of the home and interacting with others.	<b>5,000.00</b>
<b>Figjam Workshops Charitable Trust</b>	The purpose of Figjam Workshops Charitable Trust is to deliver workshops to members of the community and their families who are disadvantaged by the effects of poverty, long-term unemployment, domestic violence, substance abuse and/or low self-worth. Using art and creativity as a means to explore patterns of behaviour, these workshops provide tools which enable participants to create long-term positive changes in their lives. Funding has been awarded to run two Creative Empowerment workshops in the Auckland area.	<b>4,000.00</b>
<b>Foster Care Association Auckland</b>	The purpose of Foster Care Association Auckland is liaison with Foster Caregivers that care for children that are not their own. They run monthly support groups, produce a bi-monthly newsletter and organise events and social occasions for caregivers and children aged 0-17 years. Funding has been approved to upgrade their laptop and printer.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Foundation Alcohol Drug Education (FADE)</b>	FADE provides quality educational resources for New Zealand secondary schools, students, parents and the wider community. Funds have been approved to modify and reprint a quality 6-page brochure entitled 'Young People and Drugs' which is an essential educational resource.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Foundation for Youth Development</b>	The Foundation for Youth Development is a leader in the field of youth development and runs several proven programmes that lift the skills, self-confidence, motivation and achievements of young New Zealanders. Kiwi Can is a life-skills and values programme for 5-12 year olds, delivered in primary and intermediate schools throughout New Zealand. The programme aims to equip children with a sense of self-worth and self-confidence, the ability to take responsibility and be accountable for their actions, essential life skills and a 'can-do' attitude to the challenges of life. Funding has been approved to assist with the cost of Kiwi Can training which is vital to the continual success of the programme.	<b>25,000.00</b>
<b>Franklin Young Mariner Unit</b>	Young Mariners of NZ was formed in 1981 for girls aged 8-18 years who wish to participate in an enjoyable, attractive and challenging programme of progressive maritime based training. The Franklin unit is a largely rural based unit and has to travel to take its boats and equipment, sometimes considerable distances to participate in events. Funding has been approved for the purchase of a lockable road trailer.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Garden to Table Trust</b>	The Garden to Table Trust exists to develop life-long healthier and happier eating habits in a new generation of New Zealanders by engaging them at primary school in growing, harvesting, preparing and sharing delicious food. Funding has been approved to assist with ongoing project related costs covering kitchen and garden specialist costs, infrastructure and training for two of six schools currently in the programme: Peninsula Primary and Owairaka Primary schools.	<b>20,000.00</b>

<b>Gardner Road Kindergarten</b>	Gardner Road Kindergarten is a not-for-profit community based kindergarten based in Epsom for approximately 40 years. Funding has been awarded to help upgrade ICT equipment so that they can offer a quality ICT element in the curriculum as well as allowing the teaching staff to become more efficient in some of the administrative aspects of their role.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Glen Innes Chinese Friendship Group</b>	Glen Innes Chinese Friendship Group encourages multicultural interactions and communications between Chinese and other ethnic groups. Funding has been approved to assist with costs associated with the celebration of four important festivals; mid-Autumn Festival, Chinese National Day, Christmas Parade and New Year.	<b>2,000.00</b>
<b>Glen Innes Family Centre</b>	The Glen Innes Family Centre has been providing assistance to individuals and families in desperate need in the Glen Innes area for 30 years.
